Last year,

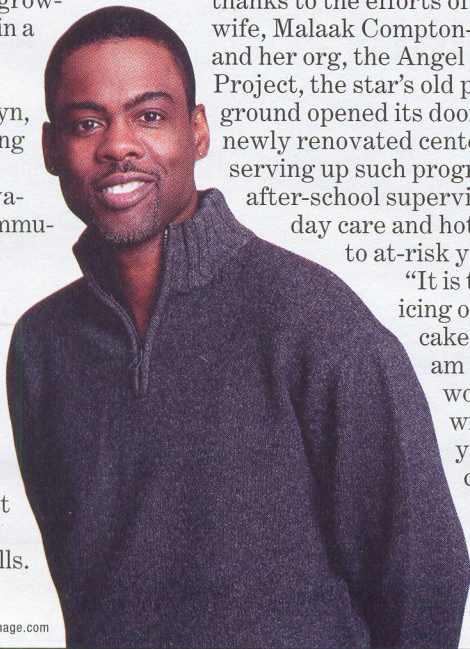
thanks to the efforts of Rock’s wife, Malaak Compton-Rock, and her org, the Angel Rock Project, the star’s old playground opened its doors to a newly renovated center, serving up such programs as after-school supervision, day care and hot meals to at-risk youth.

“It is the icing on the cake that I am able to work with young children who attend

the same center where my husband, Chris, went as a child,” says Compton-Rock. “However, I must say I am excited to expand the program to include youth from the Brownsville and Salvation Army Bedford-Stuyvesant Centers as well.”

The foundation’s various humanitarian programs include “Journey for Change,” a global exchange program for Brooklyn’s youth; South Africa Programs, which conducts educational projects in Johannesburg and Soweto; and such projects as Child Abuse Awareness, Hurricane Katrina Relief and Triple Negative Breast Cancer.
